


Great Smoky Mountains Workshops

Frozen Flower Photography

What is Frozen Flower photography?

•A single rose, completely frozen after being positioned vertically in a glass cup. As water freezes, oxygen is squeezed out of the flower, leaving beautiful trails in the ice. Frozen flower photography is a super simple way to give your floral images a unique edge .

Close-up photos of flowers

The only true way of getting **close-up**, high quality flower photos, is by using a specialized macro lens (50mm to 200mm). Macro lenses uncover details that would be impossible to detect with the unaided eye and give a new, interesting perspective on the subjects. **Close-ups** of petals and buds of the flower, or water droplets can jump out of the page.

Close –up Photography of Flowers (continued)

You can crop the image afterwards (but do remember, if you crop in heavily you will be removing pixels from the image which will affect its quality). Make your close-up photographs more dramatic by filling the frame with a single colour or texture of a plant. Capture distinct characteristics of your plants to portray personality.

Remember: Macro is not the same as a close-up shot. The picture below is a close-up not a macro shot. Macro means you're taking super close-ups of objects at 1:1. So the size of the image on your sensor is equal to the size of the item you're photographing in real life.


