

Donna Gottschalk and Jack Myers are working on a presentation for bird photography. The date has not been set yet. In the mean time, Jack put together information on the bird feeders heuses in his yard. Hopefully it inspires you to photograph birds right in your own yard. There are many places in the area to photograph birds, but the convenience of your own yard is special.

Jack's backyard birding

I have eight different feeders in my yard, some for specific birds. For example, I have an Oriole feeder that is only out from May to July, as they migrate through. Orchard Orioles and Red-Bellied Woodpeckers feed from the orange half or grape jelly that I put out. I live near Grand Rapids near the river. Over the years I have put up specific feeders for several reasons. The birds you see will differ at your location. We have a Bluebird house and ever other year they will nest. By contrast, a friend lives in Whitehouse and they are so plentiful they nested in his newspaper box at the street.

This is an upside-down thistle feeder. Only Goldfinch birds can feed on it. As you can see in the picture, the Goldfinches feed upside-down. They are the only finch that can do this.

With standard thistle feeders, there are several

different birds that will come to it. I wanted just Goldfinches.



Promaster circular polarizers and how to use them.

An apple tracking device. How does it work? Your AirTag sends out a secure Bluetooth signal that can be detected by nearby devices in the Find My network. These devices send the location of your AirTag to iCloud — then you can go to the Find My app and see it on a map. The whole process is anonymous and encrypted to protect your privacy. And it's efficient, so there's no need to worry about battery life or data usage.

(I learned the hard way.) On my last trip I did not think about taking this tracker and sadly had my gear stolen shortly before boarding the plane for Iceland. If you travel to another country I cannot stress how important it is to include this in your bag.

Street Photography

The assignment for July is Street photography. Below are some street photography thoughts from the internet:

Typically, street photography is about candidly capturing life in public areas. And contrary to its name, street photography does not have to be done on the streets. You can do street photography anywhere.

A good street photo needs a clearly defined subject. All the rules of composition, such as rule of thirds, leading lines, use of negative space, symmetry, frames, etc. still hold. Try and tell a story with your images. Create photographs where the viewer pauses and asks questions.

Whether or not street shots need people in them is up for debate.

Shadows can be used to capture thought-provoking shots, even if you can't see the humans casting them. You could photograph things left behind by people. These images leave the viewer wondering what the story is behind the discarded objects.

Taking photographs in public spaces is legal in "most" countries. In both Canada and the United States, this is true. If you are in a public area, you are well within your rights to take pictures. However, it is important to realize that even if you are shooting in a public space, you must exercise a reasonable expectation of privacy.

The 4th of July holiday should provide some good opportunities for street photography.
