Updates from the Board

The board members have been working very hard over the summer reviewing our Constitution, Bylaws, yearly events, budgets and membership dues. Please make sure you have reviewed all the changes in the Constitution and Bylaws.

Over the past several years, costs for the club have risen, with the rent increasing \$500 in the past 4 years being the largest expense. The club dues have been the same for at least 17 years. The board has decided to increase the dues to help offset the rising costs.

Starting October 3 , 2022, dues will increase \$5, from \$45 to \$50 for members. The discount for couples is being eliminated. Student dues will stay at \$20.

Grand Rapids Bridge Sunset Outing

The railroad carts hold up to 8 people each. You can take a tripod. They will position the carts on the bridge over the river so that none of the bridge supports block our view. When we did this last year, some people arrived early and walked around the area taking pictures. We were on the bridge about an hour.

Improve Your Photography Classes

The Improve Your Photography classes start Tuesday, September 13th, at 7 PM. There are five classes on five consecutive Tuesdays. IYP is available to the public and members. Registration is required. The cost is \$30 for members and \$75 for non-members. There is a link on the website to register. The first night is Camera Basics. Night 2 is Exposure. Night 3 is Hands-on Exercises with five stations to demonstrate lighting, depth-of-field, photographing pan and blur, the interaction of ISO, shutter and aperture, and finally, white balance. Night 4 is Composition. Night 5 is software editing using Photoshop Elements.

We will need help from members for night 1 and night 2 to help the participants navigate their cameras- Nikon, Sony and Canon. Night 3, the hands-on night, we will need 5 members to do the demonstration stations. Other members will be present to help with questions and explanations.
