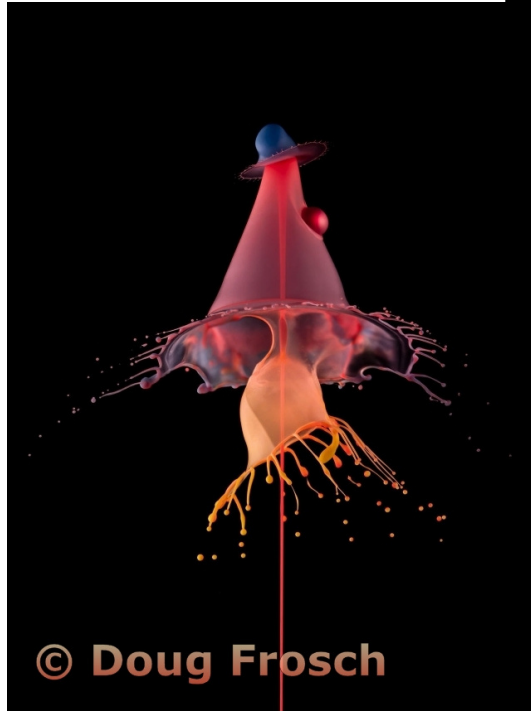

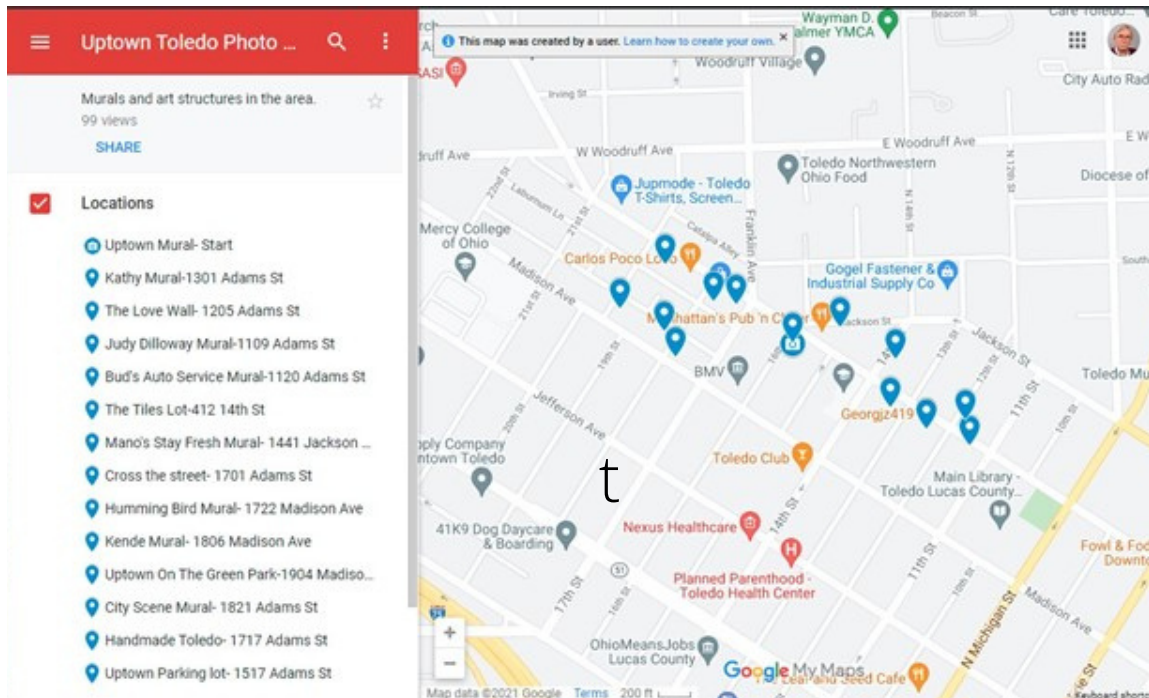


Photo Opportunities

Shoot the Sunset on the Maumee River at Grand Rapids, Ohio, from the vantage point of the railroad bridge

The volunteers of the Toledo & Lake Erie & Western Railroad have two small open passenger carts they pull on the railroad track for the public to view the river and surrounding landscape. We have scheduled Saturday July 10 (weather dependent) to ride these carts out on the bridge to shoot the sunset on the river. This is a unique perspective of the river.

Sunset is at 9:10 PM. I anticipate we will be on the bridge until 9:30 PM. Attached is a photo I took during the day.

Each cart accommodates 3 people with tripods. The donation is \$5 per person although you may give more if you wish.

We will meet at the railroad crossing for the shoot at 8:30 PM.

Prior to this you will have the option to eat at one of the many restaurants and/or walk around town photographing.

Northeast Ohio Waterfalls

Bickle's Hardware and Supply

They've helped build the Sir Adam Beck Generating Station, the Garden City Skyway, and the Welland Canal that carries ships below that massive bridge. They even supplied parts for the building of the new World Trade Center in New York City, which replaced the twin towers destroyed in the 2001 terrorist attacks. The company's focus on industrial wholesale, construction and major manufacturing firms such as General Motors and E.S. Fox meant it carved out its own unique niche market.

Bickles has done that largely below the radar of regular folks in Niagara Falls for the past 99 years, operating out of a nondescript building on Main Street, adjacent to the Niagara Falls Farmers Market. The business didn't even have a sign per se. But that all changed when Bickles unveiled a stunning new five-ton piece of art erected on the front of the store. The work, a sculpture created by New York City artist Sergio Furnari, erected by cranes and made of gleaming stainless steel, features 11 life-sized steelworkers sitting atop a massive riveted beam — a recreation of a famous photo taken 850 feet above Manhattan in 1932 with the men building the Rockefeller Center eating lunch while sitting on a beam. Each figure weighs about 800 pounds, so including the beam they're sitting on the artwork weighs in at more than 10,000 pounds. The sculptures are so detailed that they include tears and burn holes in the steelworkers' denim clothes, shoelaces in battered work boots, and one of the men is lighting the cigarette of another — exactly like in the photo."
