Greetings Club Members,

I wanted to pass along some updates regarding photos being displayed in the clubhouse that are FOR SALE.

Traditionally we have not asked for a commission percentage when items are sold.

Myself and our board members have researched and thought long and hard about this.

We have met with other artists in the village and they have a % commission within their clubs. Clubs such as Toledo Artists, Stained Glass and the Potter's Guild.

It is in the best interest of the club that we receive 15% of the total sale of the piece sold.

If the item is paid for by cash or check then it would be 15% returned to the club.

If the item is paid for using a credit transaction then it would be 15% plus the processing fee.

We are working very hard to finalize the ability to accept credit card payments.

All payments would be made out to the PHOTO ARTS CLUB OF TOLEDO. The treasurer would then send the artist the check after the commission/credit fees are deducted.

The commission rates would go into effect immediately.


